Those who have an internal locus of control can manage emotions and succeed in their way (Qurrahtulain et al., 2022).

A high internal locus of control in a person can balance work and life in his life (Michel et al, 2011). The internal locus of control in a person will make a greater contribution to the perceived work stress compared to the external locus of control (Karkoulian et al., 2016). Further. Internal locus of control is positively related to motivation, psychological empowerment, self-efficacy, and self-esteem (Zhou et al., 2016). 


Figure 1. Five Stages of Bibliometric Literature Study Method Source:(Fahimnia et al., 2015)

- 2. Initial search results

There are several provisions in the selection of journals, including journals for the year 2020-2022 and having the type of article as a research article. Where data is collected from science direct.

- 3. Refinement of the search results
  - The total number of journals obtained by using the keywords and conditions set was 25 articles from 2020-2022.
- 4. Initial data statistics

A collection of articles that have complied with the stipulated provisions will be saved using the RIS format. At this stage, the researcher collects data such as the name of the researcher, year, year of publication, publisher, and keywords.

5. Data analysis

Data analysis in this study was assisted by VOSviewer software to see co-authorship, co-occurrence, and citations. (Van Eck & Waltman, 2010) wrote that the VOSviewer software can be used to analyze the similarities between different objects.

## a. Co-Authorship




Figure 2. Co-Authorship (Related)




Figure 3. Co-Authorship (not related)

#### b. Co-Accurrence




Figure 4. Co-Accurrence (Keywords)




Figure 5. Overlay Visualization Co-Accurance (Keywords)

Meanwhile, most keyword developments occurred in 2021. These findings can be used as input for further research to further explore the internal locus of control.

### c. Citation

Citation analysis is used to determine which articles have the greatest influence on the internal locus of control. Table 1 provides more detail regarding the top 10 cited on the topic of internal locus of control.

Based on table 1, the most citations are from research conducted by Canestrino et al.,(2020) with 34 citations until April 2022. The purpose of Canestrino et al.,(2020) research is to know that culture can affect social entrepreneurship (SE). by focusing on Global Leadership and Organizational Behavior Effectiveness. Research (Canestrino et al., 2020) was published in the Journal of Business Research Volume 110.

the second citation is research from Awaworyi Churchill et al., (2020) published in the Journal of Economic Behavior & Organization volume 178 with a total of 13 citations. The study aims to examine how the locus of control is indifferent to genders. From this research, it can be seen that gender is an important factor in the locus of control, the third-largest citation is research from Amoros et al., (2021) which has been cited 12 times until April 2022. The purpose of the research is to compare welfare between entrepreneurs and nonentrepreneurs or to try to identify the factors that determine welfare. subjective to them.

From the results of the analysis that has been carried out, it is found that research related to an internal locus of control can be seen that the relationship between authors is still small. It can be seen that there is only 1 cluster in this study, so it is hoped that in the future more researchers will collaborate for higher-quality research results to be obtained.

The development of keywords from 2022 is still relatively small where there are only 2 new keywords. From the keywords, it is also known that locus of control can directly affect mental health. People with an internal locus of control can manage emotions and succeed in their way (Qurrahtulain et al., 2022). Locus of control can be a major predictor of job

Internal locus of control citations is mostly research conducted by Canestrino et al. (2020).

### CONCLUSIONS

This study uses bibliometric analysis techniques to determine 3 main aspects: co-authorship, co-occurrence, and citation. The articles in this study were obtained from science directly for a period of 3 years, namely from 2020-2022. From the provisions that have been set through keywords and other limitations, there are 25 articles obtained.

## **SUGGESTIONS**

From this study, it can be seen that the development of research related to an internal locus of control is relatively small, so it can be concluded that further researchers can take the topic of internal locus of control to further deepen the impact and factors related to the topic.
